## 1. WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

**TYPE:** Swiss law governed notes.

**TERM:** The term of the product ends on the Final Redemption Date, unless the product has been terminated or redeemed early.

**OBJECTIVES:** Capped Floored Floating Rate Notes are primarily targeted at investors who look for a capital protected investment with financial liquidity at any time. The products allow you to benefit from an increasing SOFR rate exceeding the floor level of 4.10% p.a. with a cap at 5.40% p.a.

The potential return on the product is limited to the aggregate of the Interest Payment Amounts scheduled to be paid under the product, if any. This means that the return on the product is capped. If the products are early redeemed, you may receive a redemption amount that is considerably lower than the Final Redemption Amount that would have otherwise been received. In such case, you may suffer a partial loss on its investment.

Under normal market conditions, Bank Julius Baer & Co. Ltd. Zurich will endeavour to provide a secondary market (bid-only), but is under no legal obligation to do so.

**INTEREST:** The manufacturer shall pay the relevant Interest Payment Amount per product on each Interest Payment Date (as specified below) to you, provided that the products have not been redeemed, repurchased or cancelled on or prior to such Interest Payment Date. The Interest Payout Amount is a cash amount equal to the product of the Denomination, the Day Count Fraction with respect to the relevant Interest Period and the relevant Interest Rate (floored at 4.10% p.a. and capped at 5.40% p.a.).

**FINAL REDEMPTION:** Unless previously redeemed, repurchased or cancelled, on the Final Redemption of the product on the Final Redemption Date, you will receive in addition to the Interest Payout Amount the Final Redemption Amount, which is equal to 100% of the Denomination.

The product terms also provide that if certain extraordinary events occur, adjustments may be made to the product and Julius Baer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlyings, the product and the product manufacturer. Therefore, investors should be prepared to sustain a partial or total loss of their investments.

## 2. WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND WHAT COULD I GET IN RETURN?

### RISK INDICATOR



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until 14 July 2031. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because Julius Baer is not able to pay you.

Julius Baer has classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact Julius Baer's capacity to pay you.

**Be aware of currency risk. If the currency of your account is different to that of this product, you will be exposed to currency risk, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.**

This product does not include any protection from future market performance, so you could lose some or all of your investment.

## 3. WHAT HAPPENS IF JULIUS BAER IS UNABLE TO PAY OUT?

This may materially adversely affect the value of the product and could lead to you losing some or all of your investment in the product. The product is not a deposit and as such is not covered by any deposit protection scheme.

### COSTS OVER TIME

## 5. HOW LONG SHOULD I HOLD IT AND CAN I TAKE MONEY OUT EARLY?

### Recommended holding period: 14 July 2031 (maturity date)

The product aims to provide you with the return described under “1. What is this product?” above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity.

Disinvestment can only be done by selling the product either through the exchange (if the product is listed) or off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. No fees or penalties will be charged by Julius Baer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.

In volatile or unusual market conditions, or in the event of technical disruptions, the sale of the product can be temporarily hindered or suspended and may not be possible at all.
