OBJECTIVES: An Accrual Note is primarily targeted at investors expecting a fixed amount at maturity of the product. It offers you the Final Redemption Amount being a cash amount equal to 100.00% of the Denomination plus the accrued interest at the Bonus Rate during the Accrual Period. There will be no interest payments during the term of the product. The product provides you a termination right (Holder Put Option), subject to written notice. The potential return is limited to the accrued interest in the Accrual Period determined by reference to the Bonus Rate scheduled to be paid at maturity of the product. Under normal market conditions, Bank Julius Baer & Co. Ltd. Zurich will endeavour to provide a secondary market (bid-only), but is under no legal obligation to do so.
